The Association of Citizens "Something More" has three official offices: Central Office Sarajevo, Regional Office Mostar and Regional Office East New Sarajevo.

The staff of the Association works and lives in four cities of Bosnia and Herzegovina: Sarajevo, Banja Luka, Mostar and East Sarajevo. The Mostar office of the Association is located on the farm of the Association in Humilišani, where all the necessary conditions for the work of the staff have been created - one building on the property has been renovated so that there are offices, classrooms and a conference hall in the building.

In order to ensure sustainability, the Association has established its own social enterprise EkoDizajn d.o.o. which deals with the production of organic seedlings, arranging yards and orchards according to permaculture principles and organizing events, trainings.

UG Nešto Više operates throughout Bosnia and Herzegovina, so that in the last 23 years we have implemented projects in over 70 different local communities in BiH and over a hundred volunteer actions in the same number of communities.

# **Project "Communities of different but equal citizens"** (2018-2021)

We aims to achieve a higher level of involvement of civil society organizations in the process of European integration, focusing on increasing social inclusion and non-discrimination of persons with disabilities. The project will contribute to the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals 2030. The organization "UDAS" is implementing the project in partnership with the Helsinki Citizens' Parliament Banja Luka and the Association of Citizens "Nesto Više" Sarajevo. The realization of the project aims to strengthen the capacities of the network of women with disabilities and the network of persons with disabilities UDAS. In addition, the aim is to increase the social sensitivity of civil society organizations, which are not primarily organizations of persons with disabilities, as well as representatives of local authorities. Work has also been done to increase promotional activities and public advocacy for the integration of persons with disabilities, through various activities of civil society organizations, media, government and the public, which will eventually result in the inclusion of persons with disabilities in decision-making processes.

## The Eco HUB Mostar Resource Centre for Environmental Issues (2020-2022)

The Project is being implemented in four municipalities / cities: Mostar, Trebinje, Konjic and Jablanica. The project is being realized within the larger project "Think Nature!". The goal of Eco HUB is to contribute to the preservation and regeneration of the environment in Herzegovina through the establishment and operation of Eco HUB Mostar and by providing support to local communities in preserving the environment. The establishment of Eco HUB Mostar creates the necessary preconditions for supporting local communities in the development and implementation of projects and actions in the field of environmental protection, and making available the permaculture farm Nešto Više and a place where people can see practical solutions in this area, such as solar panels, water purification, rainwater collection, etc. "Think Nature!" Is a three-year project implemented by the Center for the Promotion of Civil Society, and financially supported by Sweden in the amount of 3 million convertible marks. The complexity of environmental issues requires a continuous presence at the local level, expertise in the field of environmental protection, networking with local actors, the ability to communicate with youth, schools and media, and the capacity to provide educational and professional support to other organizations and schools, and that will be provided throug Eco Hub.

#### **Local Structures for WB6 Lab - RISE**

(2020-2022)

Regional Incubator for Social Entrepreneurs is a project for motivated, committed young people, who are ready to learn and make changes for the benefit of the Western Balkans. The goal is to support social entrepreneurial ideas that will make the region a better place. RISE Journey is a specially adapted program in which participation is free and which will help young people to learn, grow and make changes in their environment. We focus on collaboration, sharing ideas and peer learning to achieve better results. We support 6 teams from BH that develop an idea or innovative solution for a new and better approach to education, women's empowerment, culture, rural development, health or employment in their community. The skills, knowledge and experience of social entrepreneurship will help address social and environmental issues. RISE Journey provide support through grants for mobility and business development in the second phase of Journey. We represent a group of 11 partners from the Western Balkans, Germany and France working together to develop social entrepreneurship to have better societies. Our Association is one of 6 organizations from the Western Balkans selected as "Local Structure (LS)" by WESTERN BALKANS - RYCO, GROUPE SOS Pulse, the South East European Youth Network (SEEYN), the Institut Français and the Franco -German Youth Office (FGYO / OFAJ)

# Improving the advocacy skills of PWDs and the sustainable operation of PWD organizations

(2020-2021)

Project implemented with six organizations of persons with disabilities. Within the project, a detailed analysis of the presence of each of the six organizations on social networks and the Internet was made. An analysis of both human resources and an analysis of media presence and the degree of their advocacy skills, as well as the degree of their development and sustainable operation, was performed. Based on the analyzes, recommendations were made in order to strengthen them and joint networking in order to better position in lobbying and advocating policies concerning persons with disabilities.

# First Practical Work Experience for Women with University degree (2020-2021)

The project aims to contribute to faster and easier employment of highly educated girls / women who have no work experience. Through the project, we will provide a two-month paid internship for 38 young women in their final years of study or with a university degree without work experience. With this project, we continue to provide opportunities for young women (from 20 to 30 years old) to gain their first practical work experience lasting 2 months (320 working hours) in one of the companies in BiH from their field of interest and studies. In addition to practical experience, all participants will receive training in CV writing and training on proper performance at a job interview. The staff of UG Nešto Više will provide support to the participants in the process of finding a suitable company in which they will be able to gain their first work experience.

# My Work - Economic Opportunities for People with Disabilities (2020-2022)

The project focuses on social inclusion and status improvement of mentally challenged individuals in Bosnia and Herzegovina, especially aiming to bolster their economic opportunities and the ability to exercise their rights as citizens. In Bosnia and Herzegovina, people with mental disabilities are often targets of discrimination and prejudices which negatively impacts their position on the job market. It is difficult for these individuals to find and keep employment and coupled with insufficient support from state authorities they are more prone to poverty and social exclusion. The project sets out to help mentally-challenged people through the implementation of an integrated activity package that includes, for example, piloting and expanding of approach of the supported employment, activities aimed at generating income and acceleration program for businesses which are employing people with disabilities, mediation of professional training and internships for the disabled, workshops for businesses or advocacy efforts when enforcing changes on strategic- and political-level with the aim to familiarize the public with said problematics.

## **Development of Training Program for Members of Municipal Gender Equality Commissions in Bosnia and Herzegovina**

(2021-2023)

Overall objective of the project is strengthening the role and position of women in political, social and economic processes and support local partnerships in establishing effective mechanisms for gender equality in local communities in B&H. The target group are members of gender equality commissions in 20 local governments that will go through a tailor-made training program in order to strengthen their capacity to achieve a greater level of gender equality at the local level. The communities in which the project is implemented are: Bosanska Krupa, Busovača, Derventa, Goražde, Ilidža, Kalesija, Kalinovik, Jajce, Laktaši, Mostar Nevesinje, Kostajnica, Novo Sarajevo, Prijedor, Prnjavor, Šamac, Tešanj, Teslić, Tuzla i Vlasenica.

# Youth Retention Program in BiH – "General Mobilization" (2021-2024)

Project support cooperation between sectors that have not so far participated jointly in addressing the migration problems of young people from BiH, namely youth organizations and entrepreneurs, ie employers. The overall objective of the project is to strengthen the capacity of youth CSOs to participate in education and employment reform to retain young people in BiH. Specific objectives of the project are to establish Cross-sectoral network by youth experts and entrepreneurs for advocacy in employment and education; To strengthening the capacities and competencies of youth CSOs in order to increase advocacy impact for improvement policies, rules and strategies in the field of employment and education; To improve a legal and policy framework for youth through cooperation between relevant employers' associations and relevant institutions at all levels; To Increase awareness of role and importance of the loss of the youth population in BiH

# Project Mostar – Spaces to Activate and Rejuvenate (2021-2024)

The project seeks to improve public space and its use in Mostar through mobilizing citizens and supporting citizen-led initiatives that contribute to shared civic, cultural and economic life of the city. The project also aims to support citizens and local authorities to effectively use new skills, tools and mechanisms to address priorities in an inclusive, gender-sensitive, participatory and systematic manner. The project will directly provide funding infrastructural projects as well as to citizen-designed and citizen-led initiatives into shared urban space and actions.

Current volunteers - Pierre Noel, Juliette Airoldi and Adele Bertaux - spend most of their time working on farm with different plants, seeding/planting, providing maintenance and protection of the plants, and studying their growth. In addition, they are involved in other activities and projects that NV implements.

## Organized structure to combat domestic violence

We want to initiate signing the "Agreement of Cooperation" in two municipalities aimed at creating an organized structure to combat domestic violence and offer more appropriate support to the victims. Our goal is to involve the Centre of Public Safety, Ministry of Internal Affairs, Centre for Social Welfare, the Out-patient clinic, Municipal authority, media, primary and secondary schools and kindergartens in the process. Through this cooperation we can have stronger cooperation among Police, Centre for social work and organizations, in accordance with their respective mandates, that are dealing with this issues.

As result we want them to have strong sensibility and established operative multisectoral structure to properly address those problems, and victims of domestic violence to gain their confidence in local institutions and encourage themselves to request support and help from those institutions.

# **Cooperation with College of St. Benedict and St. John's University** (2021-2022)

The E-Scholars program is designed for students with an entrepreneurial mindset. Students with an entrepreneurial mindset are always looking for new opportunities and they are driven to make things happen. Once selected into the program, students are expected to attempt to launch a venture before they graduate. Students in the program will experience business travel both nationally and internationally. The E-Scholar business trips will require students to set up and execute business visits, informational interviews, and tours of organizations. After travel to Silicon Valley and San Francisco in October, 17 students and two professors visited Bosnia and Herzegovina in December/January looking for interesting places, businesses and people to meet in Sarajevo and Mostar.


